ISSUE:

Even though Governor Christie's Budget contains an additional \$750,000 for nonpublic school nursing services, the amount is still \$1,409,000 short of what was available in the Appropriations Act last year. That final figure of \$14,311,000 was created by the Legislature after much work by the nonpublic school community. Furthermore, Governor Christie's Budget eliminated the \$2,441,000 that was added to the Nonpublic School Technology, thus reducing the amount to \$3 million.

OUR POSITION:

The New Jersey Catholic Conference and the New Jersey Network of Catholic School Families has continued to support increased funding in nonpublic school accounts. Our focus with the Legislature, particularly the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee and the Assembly Budget Committee, will be to increase the funding for nonpublic school nursing services and technology aid at least to the amount in the Appropriations Act from last year.

ACTION:

- 1. Call, email or speak directly with the offices of the members of the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee and the Assembly Budget Committee asking them to restore the level of funding in the nonpublic school nursing services and nonpublic school technology accounts at least to the level of funding in the Fiscal Year 2015 Appropriations Act. See attached List.
- 2. Give special thanks to Assemblyman Gary Schaer who is chair of the Assembly Budget Committee for his work during last year's Budget process and his willingness to increase last year's amounts in nonpublic nursing services and nonpublic technology.
- 3. If your State Senator and/or your members of the General Assembly are not on either Committee, call, email, or visit those legislators and indicate the need for this appropriation to nonpublic school students and their parents. Remind them of the tax dollars being saved to public schools in their districts by the decision of nonpublic school parents to send their children to a nonpublic school.
- 4. Repeat steps 1 and 3 periodically between now and the third week in June in order to keep your request at the forefront of Budget considerations by State legislators.
- 5. Have students write letters to their respective legislators noting how the funding for nursing and nonpublic technology funding was used this year and how the loss will affect those programs next year.





Taizé Prayer Around The Cross

You are invited to a time of meditative prayer!

Prayer around the cross is a way of expressing an invisible communion not only with the crucified Jesus but with all who suffer—all the victims of abandonment, abuse, discrimination or torture, all those condemned to silence. In the center of the Church the icon of the cross is laid flat, resting on a couple of low stools or cushions and illuminated by a few candles. While the meditative singing continues, those who wish to do so come up to the cross to pray. They can make a gesture, such as placing their forehead on the wood of the cross, as a sign that they are entrusting silently to Christ all that burdens them as well as the difficulties of other people, both those they know personally and those who are far away: the oppressed, the ill, the poor, the persecuted. This prayer reminds us that here and now, risen from the dead, Christ accompanies every human being in his or her suffering, even when his presence is not recognized.

Called & Gifted Workshop Coming to Our Lady of Peace Parish

Dear St. Mary School Parents/Guardians,

I am very excited to share with you an upcoming moment of growth and transformation in the life of Our Lady of Peace Parish (OLOPP). This May we will begin a period of discernment to help us better use God's gifts in our parish. *Called & Gifted* is a nationally-renowned three-part process to help people discern their *charisms* - gifts of the Holy Spirit that are primarily given to us for others' benefit.

When we spend our time using our charisms (as opposed to other gifts or skills) a few things start to happen. Instead of "1% of Catholics doing 90% of the work," we learn to share responsibility for the Church's mission. Burnout is less likely, too, because we're not constantly spending our own energy, but God is really flowing through us. Finally - and here's where we should all get really excited - whenever we use our charisms, we provide opportunities for others to encounter our risen Lord, opportunities for evangelization. When you and I use mere skills, on the other hand, we are mostly helping people to encounter ourselves.

On **May 15 and 16**, in Assumption Hall, a seminar will be presented, including the opportunity to take a "spiritual gifts inventory" which suggests what charisms we each might have. That's part one. Later on, part two is an hour-long phone interview to discern more clearly and discuss the specific charisms the person might have. Part three involves meeting in small groups while we carry out "experiments" to further discern which charisms we each might have. For example, if you think you have a charism of teaching, try to teach for a while and see how it goes! Attending the workshop does not imply an ongoing commitment to parts two and three, but we hope that many continue through the whole program.

Many of us at OLOPP are already very excited about this process. Fr. Chris has used *Called & Gifted* in the past, before he came to OLOPP, with great success. St. Mary's School, *a mission of Our Lady of Peace Parish*, is one of the largest ministries we have. As you well know, our St. Mary's School community would grind to a halt without so many parents and other family members and friends volunteering to share the gifts they already know they have. Mrs. Mancuso is looking forward to seeing how this already generous use of gifts could be honed and strengthened. Likewise, when we think about the other ministries at OLOPP, we can imagine that *Called & Gifted* has the **potential to benefit every single ministry and individual in the parish**. It will be thrilling to see people better realize their place in our many parish ministries and school activities. However, chances are that most of the charisms God has given us are for **our everyday lives outside of Church**, and discerning your charisms will help you to know and follow God's will in your families, careers, and pastimes.

We already have so much going for us, and *Called & Gifted* is an opportunity for Our Lady of Peace to live up to our awesome reputation, thereby giving thanks and glory to God. We would love for as many of our St. Mary's School families – whether parishioners of OLOPP or another parish – to have this life-changing opportunity. Please let Jackie or me know if you have any questions. I am very much looking forward to taking this next step in the life of our parish together with you!

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

- **CAP 1** teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees.
- **CAP 2** is called *No More Bullies, No More Victims* and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented.
- **CAP 3** is called *Cyber-Empowerment* and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere.

Each presentation is 90 minutes.

Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP.
