Dear Parents and Guardians,

From March 4, 2019 to March 8, 2019, students in grades 3-7 will take the *lowa Assessments*™. The purpose of this letter is to inform you about the tests so that—with your support and encouragement—your student will do his or her best on the tests.

#### About the Iowa Assessments

The *lowa Assessments* help determine how students are performing on nationwide standards. These assessments measure achievement in several important content areas including Reading, English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. The exact tests that your student takes will depend on his or her grade level.

The *Iowa Assessments* help teachers identify a student's strengths and areas that may need additional emphasis. The *Iowa Assessments* also measure student growth and progress in the content areas assessed from year to year and may provide information about college readiness for older students. The assessments produce information that enables sound decision making and provides a focus for teachers to evaluate instruction.

Each test includes sample questions to help students become familiar with the content and format of the tests. Samples help students understand what to do—how to mark answers and move from question to question.

For most tests, students read the questions and mark their answers by filling in a circle for each question. All test questions are multiple choice, and the tests last about 10 to 35 minutes.

#### How your student can prepare for test taking—and what you can do to help

A student who is well rested, well fed and has a positive attitude about testing is best prepared for testing. You can help your student do his or her best by considering these tips:

- Make sure that your student is in school and on time on test days. Reschedule dentist appointments and other out-ofschool time on non-testing days.
- Make sure your student gets a good night's sleep and eats a healthy breakfast before each day of testing.
- Remind your student that these tests are only **one** measure of what he or she has learned. Emphasize that you have confidence in his or her ability to do the best job possible.
- Remind your student to listen to the directions and read each question carefully during testing. Encourage your student to ask the teacher for help if he or she does not understand the directions.

#### Score reporting and how we use test results

The school will receive test scores in about 6 weeks. These scores will indicate how your student performed on the tests compared with students across the nation in the same grade. Discuss the test results with your student, and if you have any questions, contact your student's classroom teacher. St. Mary School uses test results to measure individual student growth from year to year and to monitor the progress of class groups.

## St. Mary's Scrip Program

#### 2018/2019 School year

Dear Families,

Scrip fundraising is a no-selling program that enables families to raise money for their non-profit organization (NPO). Scrip is just another way to pay for everyday purchases using gift cards in place of cash, checks, and credit cards.

You purchase gift cards from your organization at face value, and your coordinator orders those cards from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a reduced price. The difference is an instant rebate for your organization. It's really that simple!

Orders can be sent into school with your child and in most cases, are filled the same day. We usually have Shop Rite, Wawa, Walmart, Target and Kohl's daily. All other cards are ordered on Tuesday and sent home Thursday.

Rebates are issued twice a year to families, in January and June. They can be used to reduce tuition or as a rebate to the family directly. The rebates are based off a 50/50 split between you and SMS, so if your total rebate is \$500; it would mean \$250 for you and \$250 for SMS. No selling anything and money in your pocket!

I encourage you to check out <u>www.shopwithscrip.com</u>. There you can see a full list of retailers or register for an online account. Online orders come to me directly.

\*\*Keep in mind you can use Kohl's gift cards to pay your Kohl's credit card bill in store. This allows you to shop when you have a coupon or at your convenience, then you can get your Kohl's Scrip to pay your bill.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Kindness Club will be collecting items to send to soldiers from New Jersey that are currently stationed in Afghanistan with the Army. We will be sending them a care package along with homemade cards thanking them for their service. We will begin collecting items any time after our February meeting and go until our March 18<sup>th</sup> meeting. Students can bring their donations to homeroom to be collected by Miss Smith. Below are some of the sought after items that can be a big boost to soldiers' morale.

Small/easy to carry containers of snacks

Drink mixes (Gatorade, mio, instant coffee/creamer)

Meal enhancers. Anything that can be mixed with MREs (Meals Ready to Eat), such as ramen noodles, seasoned salt, individual packets of hot sauce, mustard, relish, and ketchup.

Quick protein. Energy bars, tuna fish, non-perishable beef jerky, or beef summer sausage. Make sure the meat is labeled USDA Beef.

Candy- avoid anything that can melt such as chocolate and gum or an expiration in the next month.

Small toiletries - Toiletries. Toothbrush, toothpaste, dental floss, cotton swabs, shaving lotion, disposable razors, shampoo, individually packaged tissues.

Personal care. Individually packaged baby wipes, eye drops, lip balm, lotion

Foot care. Moleskin, medicated foot powder, ointment.

Batteries. Size AA and  $\mathcal D$  batteries are in high demand.

Minecraft is played by millions of children around the world, who use their imagination to build three-dimensional worlds with virtual building blocks in a digital, pixelated landscape. It is classed as a 'sandbox game,' which means players have the freedom to build their own creations with 'blocks' they collect and also have the opportunity to explore other people's creations with their characters. Players can choose from thousands of different 'servers' to join, which are created by other players, making every experience of Minecraft unique.

#### **GROOMING**

As the majority of users who play Minecraft are children, this makes it an 'appealing' gateway for groomers. It has been reported that some users have created worlds in Minecraft to lure young people into a conversation to ask for explicit photos. There have even been more serious cases in which children have been persuaded to meet these people in real life.

#### CYBERBULLYING & GRIEFING

In multiplayer mode there is a live chat feature which allows players to talk to other players through text. This chat functionality includes basic filtering to block out external links and offensive language being shared, but varies between each server. Griefing is when someone purposely upsets another player during the game. This can be done by ruining somebody's creation or generally doing something to spoil gameplay for another. Essentially, 'Griefing' is a form of cyberbullying and can be extremely frustrating for players.

**DISABLE OR MODERATE CHAT** 

To avoid potentially inappropriate comments in a

live chat, you can follow these steps to turn live

chat off: 1. Select 'Options' 2. Toggle the Chat

button to 'Hidden' or 'Commands Only'. Bear in

mind that the chat feature is also where your child

can enter commands during the game, so this may

restrict their game play.

MONITOR YOUTUBE TUTORIALS

Many Minecraft users turn to 'YouTube' for video

tips on improving their game play and discovering new techniques. Although many videos are age-appropriate, some include sexual references

and bad language. We suggest watching Minecraft

tutorial videos together with your child. If your

child is under the age of 13, we suggest installing

'YouTube Kids' which provides a safer platform for

children to safely find the content they want.

#### **COMMUNICATING WITH STRANGERS**

Minecraft incorporates thousands of servers to choose from which are a single world or place created by the public and allow users to play the game online or via a local area network with others. No two servers are the same and each has its own individual plug-ins which are controlled by the creator. This means that some servers will allow communication with strangers.

#### **VIRUSES & MALWARE** FROM MODS

There are several websites that offer downloadable 'mods' which modify gameplay in a number of ways. Most of the mods will be safe to use, but as they have been created by the public, they will often contain viruses that can infect your child's device and potentially try and find personal information about you or your child.

### AGE RESTRICTION & 'FANTASY VIOLENCE'

According to the 'Entertaining Software Rating Board' (ESRB), Minecraft is suitable for users aged 10+. Due to its 'Fantasy Violence,' the ESRB states that this rating has been given as 'players can engage in violent acts such as setting animals on fire and harming them with weapons. Mild explosions are occasionally heard as players use dynamite to fend off creatures and mine the environment.

#### **CHILDREN MAY BECOME ADDICTED**

As with other games, Minecraft is a game where players can keep returning with constant challenges and personal goals to achieve. Children may find it difficult to know when to stop playing, becoming absorbed in the game and losing track of time.

#### SCAN'MODS' FOR MALWARE

Minecraft 'mods' add content to games to give extra options to interact and change the way the game looks and feels. However, although 'mods' can bring fun for a child, it's important to consider that downloading and installing 'mods' could potentially infect their device with a virus or malware. In 2017, security company Symantec stated that between 600,000 and 2.5 million Minecraft players had installed dodgy apps, which hijacked player's devices and used them to power an advertising botnet. Install a malware scanner on every device that your child plays Minecraft on and make sure it's regularly kept up-to-date.

## PLAY IN 'CREATIVE' OR 'PEACEFUL' MODE

Even though the age limit is 10+, Minecraft can be quite overwhelming at times, especially for younger players or SEND children. We suggest restricting your child to play in 'creative mod or 'peaceful mode' which takes away the survival element and removes the 'scarier' ve mode' monster/zombie characters

#### **SET TIME LIMITS**

With 'Gaming Disorder' becoming an official health condition, we suggest setting a reasonable time limit when playing Minecraft. Parents can use parental controls on devices to limit the time a child plays games. It is worth having a conversation with your child to understand which 'mode' they are playing the game. This may help you decide on the amount of time you would like them to play. For example, a mini game will have an 'end,' but this will depend on how the game creator has made the 'survival mode,' the game has no end as there is no goal to be achieved other than the child's own e.g. after they have built something.

#### **CHOOSE SERVERS CAREFULLY**

To protect your child from engaging in conversation with strangers, advise them to only enter servers with people they know and trust. Your child can also create their own multiplayer server and share this with their friends, which is safer and more controlled than joining a stranger's server.


