

Dear Parents and Guardians,

From March 2, 2020 to March 6, 2020, students in grades 3-7 will take the *lowa Assessments*™. The purpose of this letter is to inform you about the tests so that—with your support and encouragement—your student will do his or her best on the tests.

About the Iowa Assessments

The *lowa Assessments* help determine how students are performing on nationwide standards. These assessments measure achievement in several important content areas including Reading, English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. The exact tests that your student takes will depend on his or her grade level.

The *Iowa Assessments* help teachers identify a student's strengths and areas that may need additional emphasis. The *Iowa Assessments* also measure student growth and progress in the content areas assessed from year to year and may provide information about college readiness for older students. The assessments produce information that enables sound decision making and provides a focus for teachers to evaluate instruction.

Each test includes sample questions to help students become familiar with the content and format of the tests. Samples help students understand what to do—how to mark answers and move from question to question.

For most tests, students read the questions and mark their answers by filling in a circle for each question. All test questions are multiple choice, and the tests last about 10 to 35 minutes.

How your student can prepare for test taking—and what you can do to help

A student who is well rested, well fed and has a positive attitude about testing is best prepared for testing. You can help your student do his or her best by considering these tips:

- Make sure that your student is in school and on time on test days. Reschedule dentist appointments and other out-ofschool time on non-testing days.
- Make sure your student gets a good night's sleep and eats a healthy breakfast before each day of testing.
- Remind your student that these tests are only **one** measure of what he or she has learned. Emphasize that you have confidence in his or her ability to do the best job possible.
- Remind your student to listen to the directions and read each question carefully during testing. Encourage your student to ask the teacher for help if he or she does not understand the directions.

Score reporting and how we use test results

The school will receive test scores in about 6 weeks. These scores will indicate how your student performed on the tests compared with students across the nation in the same grade. Discuss the test results with your student, and if you have any questions, contact your student's classroom teacher. St. Mary School uses test results to measure individual student growth from year to year and to monitor the progress of class groups.

ACTION ALERT COMPENSATORY EDUCATION

ISSUE: Chapter 192 (Compensatory Education) provides remedial instruction in Reading,

Language Arts, and Mathematics for students in nonpublic schools. However, the program service been reduced as a result of an increase in enrollment in the program and the freeze in funding at \$995.33 since the 2008-2009 school year. The amount of time provided for the service has also been decreased since the 2008-2009 school year as a result of costs incurred by the providers of the service.

OUR

POSITION: The New Jersey Catholic Conference and the New Jersey Network of Catholic

School Families fully support this issue in order to remediate children in compensatory education and to increase their success for the future.

ACTION: Call, write or email the Office of Governor Phil Murphy and indicate that it has

been over 10 years since this program has received a statutory increase. The amount listed in the Budget language should be at least \$1,100.00 per service in order to provide additional time for the teaching of these three subject areas. See

ACTION ALERT Nonpublic School Transportation

ISSUE: Nonpublic school transportation continues to be problematic for many students

with the result being that parents receive aid-in-lieu payments instead of transportation. Parent's aid-in-lieu does not help in getting their children to and from a nonpublic school because many parents have no alternative other than busing. Our parents are at the mercy of private bus contractors who provide over

85% of nonpublic transportation.

OUR

POSITION: The New Jersey Catholic Conference and the New Jersey Network of Catholic

School Families fully support an increase in the statutory ceiling of \$1,000 per pupil for transportation. The increase should at least be \$50.00 per pupil in order

to have transportation routes run for our students.

ACTION: Call, write or email the Office of Governor Phil Murphy and ask for the requested

Character Education Through Sports

Celebrating Black History Month

February is designated as Black History Month, a time to celebrate the rich heritage of African Americans and honor their achievements throughout United States history. In sports, today's generation owes a great deal to trailblazing legends like <u>Jackie Robinson</u>, <u>Wilma Rudolph</u> and <u>Jesse</u> Owens.

Another remarkable, although typically unknown figure in championing the rights of all children regardless of "race, creed or color" was Bishop Bernard Sheil. Bishop Sheil founded the Catholic Youth Organization on the South-side of Chicago in 1930 with a goal to integrate the city's youth. The original mission of the CYO was to serve all children



without regard to race, creed or color through sports programs for boys and girls that promoted character development and taught young athletes to be engaged citizens. Sheil's CYO was an exercise in interracialism nearly three decades before the civil rights movement was recognized. It was fitting that during February 2017, *Play Like a Champion* co-hosted an event discussing these historical roots and considering how Catholic youth sports championed for the rights of every child to play sports in a positive environment.



Unfortunately one does not have to look far in today's world of sports to see examples of racism, hatred or a lack of charity. The latest study by the University of Central Florida's Institute for Diversity and Ethics indicates that there were 52 reported acts of racism in sports in the United States during 2018, a 27% increase over the previous year. Internationally, racist incidents in sports were up 73%. Research by the same institute also gave a failing grade to racial and gender diversity

when it comes to hiring coaches. Clearly, we still have lots of work still to do in order to assure an equal playing field for all.

As coaches in the Play Like A Champion community, you share in our goal to assure that

all children have the opportunity to participate in a positive athletic environment, one where each child can GROW and develop physically, mentally and spiritually without fear or injustice. As we celebrate Black History Month, we invite all coaches to have a discussion with your team and reflect on how your community can commit to creating a welcoming culture and a better society. The following questions may help guide your discussion:

- 1. What prejudices do we struggle with on our team?
- 2. Does our team language and actions promote justice and equality or do we tear others down?
- 3. What can we do to commit to building diversity and inclusion on our team, in our school/league and in our broader community?

Together, we can all work to continue the movement started by those we celebrate during this month. Let's make sports a place where all children can experience the joy of competition, friendship and community.
