

All required documentation must be submitted for the application to be processed. **Only completed applications will be considered.** It is the responsibility of the family to supply all necessary paperwork.

Champion Athlete Note

Educating and Forming Champion Athletes

Take Ownership & Play with Pride

Core values are the foundation for all great teams. Commonly defined as the beliefs or principals that guide the behavior of a group, core values tell the world what *matters* to your team while serving as a constant reminder to athletes and coaches how the team will measure success. Often, these core values promote themes such as attitude, effort, respect for teammates, or other virtues important to developing as athletes and



persons. They provide a way to focus a team on what's important and an important standard that all members of the team are expected to uphold.

With two national championships in the past four seasons, the Villanova men's basketball program is one of the very best in the nation. So you can be sure they have a set of core values that are the foundation of their team. However, it's not the coaches who are primarily responsible for upholding these values, but rather the athletes. As Head Coach Jay Wright explains in the video above, it's up to the athletes on a team to take ownership and maintain core values. In particular, Wright notes that older members of the team should take pride in the team and embrace the responsibility of teaching younger team members about the team's values. Having sent several players to the NBA, Wright is quick to remind them that on a team, "everyone's role is different, but everyone's status is the same."

What are your team's core values? If these aren't already established by your coach, ask if you can take the lead and work with other members of the team to create them. Once established, return to these values frequently and use them to evaluate your performance as individuals and a team following practices and games. Doing so will develop a team identity and create habits that will help you to grow into *Champions*.

Creating a Captain's Council

Last week's *Champion Coach Note* discussed selecting and developing team captains for coaches. Athletes can also play an important part in developing the role that captains play by understanding this important position and considering how to increase the effectiveness of captains with the team and in the school. One of the ways that *Play Like a Champion* encourages partners to do this is to create a Captain's Council. This unique



group involves getting team captains together as a group on a regular basis to meet with school leadership, who provide the athletes with a platform to discuss issues, develop leadership skills, and enable teams to work together effectively. The video above details an example from St. Mary's High School in Annapolis, Maryland; they named their council S.A.I.L. which stands for Student Athletes in Leadership.
