Please pack shoes in separate bags (not mixed with other items). We will be paid more for shoes donated this way.





Annual Notification of Asbestos Management Plan

To: Staff, Teachers, Building Occupants and Employee Organizations or Legal Guardians

In the past, asbestos was used extensively in building materials because of its insulating, sound absorbing, and fire retarding capabilities. Virtually any building constructed before the late 1970s contained some asbestos. Intact and undisturbed asbestos materials generally do not pose a health risk. Asbestos materials, however, can become hazardous when, due to damage or deterioration over time, they release fibers. If the fibers are inhaled, they can lead to health problems, such as cancer and asbestosis.

In 1986, Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) which requires schools to be inspected to identify any asbestos containing building materials. Suspected asbestos-containing building materials were located, sampled (or assumed) and rated according to condition and potential hazard. Every three (3) years, St. Mary School will have a reinspection conducted to determine whether the condition of the known or assumed asbestos containing building materials (ACBM) has changed and to make recommendations on managing or removing the ACBM. At the last re-inspection conducted on October 2, 2014, all materials listed in the Management Plan as asbestos containing (or assumed to be asbestos-containing) were inspected.

The law further requires an asbestos management plan to be in place by July 1989. St. Mary School developed a plan, as required, which will continue to be updated. The plan has several ongoing requirements: publish a notification on management plan availability and the status of asbestos activities; educate and train its employees about asbestos and how to deal with it; notify short-term or temporary workers on the locations of the asbestos containing building materials; post warning labels in routine maintenance areas where asbestos was previously identified or assumed; follow set plans and procedures designed to minimize the disturbance of asbestos containing building materials; and survey the condition of these materials every six (6) months to assure that they remain in good condition.

Legendary basketball coach John Wooden once remarked, "A good coach can change a game. A great coach can change a life." Darrell "Flash" Gordon knows all about transformational leadership. A former Notre Dame linebacker and 1988 National Champion, Gordon's life was transformed by great coaches. In the video above, he explains how his "Flash Points" can help people change from who they are to who they want to become. These simple steps can help coaches to work with athletes of all ages to maximize their potential on and off the field.

Are you a transformational coach? Ponder this question, then find one way that you can work to focus on promoting positive growth with your athletes. Often, this begins by simply demonstrating that you *care*. Consider how the process described in the video can be used yourself or with your team, then start the process of making the change you want to see a reality.


