Dear Parents and Guardians

Please follow the traffic patterns painted on the black top for arrival and dismissal. At dismissal, when entering the parking lot, immediately turn left and park in the second or third rows. If you park in the first row you will need to wait until dismissal has concluded to back out. This is for the safety of our students and those who pick them up. Thank you for your cooperation.

It would be greatly appreciated if parents/guardians picking up their children leave their dogs at home or in the car during dismissal.

St. Mary School provides an outstanding academic curriculum focused on the needs of each student. All students, no matter their age, learn differently, and our teachers work tirelessly to find and use methods to help each student thrive. During the school year, teachers of grades 1 through 8 will be using an assessment called Star 360. This assessment has been used in grades 1-8 over the past few years, so your child is likely familiar with the assessment. Students take a reading and a math assessment on a computer 3 times during the year (September, January, and May) for a total of about one hour each time. Teachers receive student results immediately that they can use as another source of input to help them provide each child with resources and instruction that will best help them to thrive. Our first test will take place during the week of September 23rd.

The Star Assessments provide teachers with information that will help them to 1) track student progress toward grade-level standards that are aligned with our curriculum, 2) identify skills that need to be reinforced and more advanced skills for which each student is prepared, and 3) compare student learning and progress to typical learning and progress for their grade and age, and 4) pinpoint more accurately each student's instructional reading level to select the right level of challenge for their reading materials.

All parents will receive a report at the end of the year that will provide you with information about your child(ren)'s progress during the year and ways that you can support their continued development at home.

We are excited about using this tool to help us continue to meet your child(ren)'s individual needs and build on the solid academic formation that our school already provides.


Teacher Gift Certificates:



<u>Annual School Integrated Pest Management Notification</u> <u>for St. Mary's School</u>

As part of a school pest management plan, *St. Mary's School* may use pesticides to control pests. 

Educating and Forming Champion Coaches

The Value of Play

Why is *play* important? Adults today often separate the concept of *play* from *competition*, thinking of play as a sort of carefree activity for children that's far different than the hard work and dedication required to be successful in the sports arena. This detachment is a mistake on several levels. *Play* is not only critical for the healthy development of each child, it is the foundation of a coaching philosophy that supports an athlete's physical, mental and social/emotional growth. It's also key to understanding how sports play into our faith journey.



<u>In the short video above</u>, Dr. Nancy Michael addresses the value of play and its impact on the development of a child's nervous system. It's a fascinating connection. For the past decade, Dr. Michael has served as the Director of Undergraduate Studies for the Neuroscience and Behavior major at the University of Notre Dame. At this past summer's *Sports Leadership Conference*, <u>she provided tremendous insight into how the human brain processes play</u> and how coaches can benefit from understanding this area [attendees will also remember this session for the presence of a human brain].

When we facilitate play, we put athletes in the best position to succeed both on and off the field. Play becomes integral to competition; it's through the enjoyment of sport that athletes develop the motivation and skills to perform at their very best. What's more, St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that the proper understanding of play is virtuous and thus draws us closer to a God who delights in our playfulness. In play, we use the gifts and talents He has given us to glorify Him!

Many coaches will read this while still in the early stages of fall seasons. Take a moment this week to consider how you can maintain a healthy understanding of play and create an environment that supports this approach during practices and games. It just may be that play is the all-important ingredient missing from a *champion* team.
