Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this message finds you and your family in good health and ready to enjoy the upcoming Spring Break. We have already started thinking ahead to next school year and are so grateful that you have chosen St. Mary School for your children.

At St. Mary School, we believe that education is about more than just academics. It's about nurturing the whole child—mind, body, and spirit. Catholic schools are uniquely positioned to offer an education that blends rigorous academic standards with spiritual and moral development, creating a foundation that supports lifelong learning and character formation.

Here are a few reasons why families continue to choose Catholic schools:

1. Faith-Based Environment

Our students grow in a Christ-centered community where values like compassion, integrity, service, and respect are lived out each day. Faith is woven into every aspect of school life—not just in religion class, but in how we treat one another and serve our communities.

2. Academic Excellence

Catholic schools are known for strong academic programs, high graduation rates, and preparation for success in higher education and beyond. We set high standards and support each student to meet their full potential through dedicated teachers and a caring, disciplined environment.

3. Personalized Attention

With smaller class sizes and a close-knit community, every student is known by name and nurtured as an individual. Our teachers and staff are committed to building strong relationships with students and families to help children thrive.

4. Moral and Character Formation

Beyond academics, Catholic education places a strong emphasis on forming ethical, responsible citizens. Students are encouraged to think critically, act justly, and live lives of purpose guided by Gospel values.

5. A Legacy of Leadership and Service

Our graduates go on to become leaders in their communities—academically prepared and spiritually grounded. Many Catholic school alumni credit their faith-based education with shaping who they are today.

As you know, the tuition that is charged each year does not cover the cost of educating each child at St. Mary School which is \$7,980.00. We thank you for your participation in our fund raisers and encourage you to continue to do so. These funds that are raised offset the cost of educating each child. The PTA is tasked with raising approximately \$75,000.00 to help supplement the budget. This group of very dedicated parents has done an incredible job raising funds this year! We are so grateful for the many ideas they come up with to not only raise funds but to build community. Along with fundraising efforts, Our Lady of Peace Parish makes tremendous investments to support the school in operational expenses as well as academic programs and is thereby helping to lower your tuition costs. As per the Bishop's Report: A plan for Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Camden - the parish continues to support the school

through the Interparochial Catholic School Fund (ICSF). This fund supports all Catholic Schools in the diocese thus our parish will continue to support our school and other schools in the upcoming school year. Our Lady of Peace Parish contributed \$130,121.00 to the ICSF for the current school year. The monies that each of the parishes contribute is then disbursed to the schools. Each school receives a percentage of the funds. We do not receive the entire amount donated by OLOPP. We received \$105,000.00 in ICSF this school year. During the next school year, we will receive the same amount which goes towards our budget. Tuition and fees account for approximately 78% of revenue for the school year, development/advancement/fundraising/grants account for 11%, fees, certain

development/advancement/fundraising/grants account for 11%, fees, certain fundraisers/miscellaneous income account for 9% and ICSF is 2%.

Each year we receive guidance from the diocese regarding the percentage of tuition increase for the new school year. We work very carefully on our budget so that we can keep increases to a minimum. A rise in tuition also allows for increased costs for salaries and benefits. Reenrollment through FACTS has already taken place and this information helps us make informed decisions when developing our budget. Our Open House events have been well attended and we pray for an increase in enrollment. We are budgeting for 345 students next year in grades K-8. Our current enrollment number in grades K-8 is 341 which is a slight increase from the previous year.

Tuition assistance continues to be available to those who qualify. We distributed approximately \$102,000.00 in tuition assistance from the school budget and \$22,175.00 from scholarships/grants from outside sources to our families for this current school year. Tuition for the 2025-2026 school year will increase by \$245.00 for the first child (\$24.50 per month). There will be an increase of \$185.00 for the second child (\$18.50 per month). The increase for the third child or more children is \$140.00 (\$14.00 per month). The Non-Catholic rate will increase by \$305.00 (\$30.50 per month).

Tuition rates for the 2025-2026 school year:

Catholic Students:

1st child - \$6,420.00

2nd child - \$4,860.00

3rd child (and each additional child) - \$3,790.00

Non-Catholic Students:

\$7,980.00

We will also be charging a \$140 technology fee per child which will go toward technology upgrades, Lanschool, Google Extension, STAR testing, Brain Pop, Kessler, Fitness Gram, FACTS SIS (RenWeb), as well as continuous improvements and upgrades in technology throughout the school for both students and teachers. In addition, we are blessed to have a full-time technology teacher not only as an instructor but also to assist us with technology needs throughout the day.

Thank you for entrusting us with your most precious gift—your child. We recognize that choosing a Catholic education is a significant decision for your family, and we are honored to partner with you in nurturing the hearts and minds of our students. Together, we can inspire a generation of young people who embody the values of faith, knowledge, and service.







Champion Coach Note

Educating and Forming Champion Coaches

Ownership



Coaches, do you remember the "pick-up" games we played when we were children? We, the players, choose teams, assigned positions, called plays, changed rules, enforced rules, and resolved disputes. Today's sport leagues can be so heavily adultorganized that they take away the athlete's control. *Play Like a Champion* seeks to reclaim the lessons lost from pick-up games by reminding coaches that children are the

owners of their games. Parents, coaches and league administrators are *guests*; if no adult attended, the hosts — the children — could still play. If adults created no leagues, their sons and daughters might go without league standings, playoffs, all-star teams, championship trophies, and similar touches... but the children could still choose sides and play games.

Ownership is often the forgotten element in *Play Like a Champion's* GROW approach. However, it is KEY to the athlete's whole development and trauma-informed coaching. Coaches should give your athletes *choices* and a *voice* (making sure you *LISTEN* to them); this will empower players to be responsible for the welfare of the team as a whole and allow them share in the responsibility of making team decisions and enforcing team rules and policies.

Play Like a Champion thinks of *Ownership* as having successive steps:

- Athletes feel responsible...
- They become invested in their team and...
- Grow into leaders who learn to make...
- Positive decisions (cardinal virtue of *Prudence*)

Watch Play Like a Champion Program Director Kristin Sheehan in the video above as she gives some specific examples of how you can give athletes Ownership. Then make a commitment of two tangible ways you will give control to your athletes this week in practice. By giving our kids ownership of the games they play, they will experience more fun and greater long-term benefits from the experience, GROWing in to leaders and well-rounded athletes.

"You call me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master; nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him." ~ John 13:13-16

Jesus, in these last few days leading up to Easter, as I recall your passion and death, let me remember that, above all, I am called to feed your sheep. You have given me a model of how to live; may I strive to be all that you created me for, spreading the love of God and the truth of our Catholic faith wherever I am able.
